**JPMorgan Chase ranked no. 1 among the InfoWorld 100
Award recognizes innovative use of technology**

New York, December 3, 2001 – JP Morgan Chase's merger-integration work has earned the No. 1 ranking among this year's InfoWorld 100. The list, compiled by the editors of InfoWorld, recognizes 100 companies for their innovative use of technology. This year's list spans 11 industries with the winners selected for "their ability to leverage the latest technology to bolster business efforts, maximize return on investment, streamline business processes, reduce costs, save resources, improve customer service, and create new streams of revenue."

JP Morgan Chase was awarded the top spot in 2001 for fusing together the capabilities and cultures of its heritage J.P. Morgan and Chase Manhattan organizations following their merger earlier this year. Specifically, JP Morgan Chase was cited for the "strong leadership and speedy-decision making" behind its efforts to give clients integrated financial services "not only in name but in practice."

"Our merger integration effort was all about building a globally integrated platform from which we can deliver one firm to all our clients," said Rick Mangogna and Martha Gallo, who oversaw the management of the merger from a technology and operations perspective. "We are honored that InfoWorld has recognized JP Morgan Chase as a leader in using technology to improve business performance and serve clients better."
